"SAVING LIVES, DROP BY DROP: THE BLOOD BANK STORY"

Blood Bank Services

The Blood Bank at the Cancer Institute WIA offers vital services such as donor counselling, recruitment, screening, and retention. Blood is collected from voluntary or replacement donors under aseptic conditions, processed into components, and stored at the correct temperatures. It undergoes extensive testing for infectious diseases and compatibility before transfusion. Specialized services include apheresis, therapeutic phlebotomy, and autologous blood collection. Blood components not suitable for therapeutic use are discarded per guidelines.

Blood Component Uses

- RBCs: For trauma, surgery, or conditions like anemia, hemorrhage, and cardiovascular disease.
- Platelets: Used to treat or prevent bleeding, especially in cases of liver failure or coagulopathy.
- Fresh Frozen Plasma (FFP): For bleeding disorders, urgent surgeries, or massive transfusions.

Transfusions are prescribed based on clinical indications, ensuring that the benefits outweigh the risks.

Key Blood Bank Statistics

The Blood Bank collects around 7,000 units annually, with all donations separated into components. Single donor platelet donations via apheresis reach approximately 750, while granulocyte donations are around 75 annually.

Importance of Blood Donation for Cancer Patients

Blood donations are vital for cancer patients, especially those undergoing chemotherapy or surgery, as they often require transfusions of red blood cells, platelets, and plasma to manage anemia, bleeding, and low immunity levels during treatment.

"Certain medications may affect donor eligibility for blood donation. While common drugs like vitamins, analgesics, and oral contraceptives are generally accepted, others such as antibiotics or NSAIDs require short deferral periods. Blood thinning agents, insulin, and anti-arrhythmic medications typically result in permanent deferral. Always inform the blood bank about any medications you're taking to ensure safety and eligibility."







2023-24: Establishing a Comprehensive Cancer Database

The most recent contributions have seen BNY Mellon finance the establishment of a cancer patient database, amenable to data analytic solutions, with INR 10 lakh plus INR 22 lakh for various initiatives. Additionally, they funded 25 lakh for biomedical waste INR management and INR 55 lakh for establishing a data center to support patient information and statewide cancer research surveillance, encompassing over 1,25,000 notifications annually.

2024-25: Future Focus on IT Infrastructure

Looking ahead to 2024-25, BNY Mellon has pledged INR 35 lakh to enhance the Cancer Institute's IT infrastructure, ensuring it remains at the forefront of cancer care and research.

This important project aimed to support beedi rolling women by training them in the craft of wig making, offering them a sustainable alternative to their traditional livelihoods. Through this initiative, the women learned valuable skills that not only provided them with a new source of income but also enabled them to create high-quality wigs for cancer patients suffering from alopecia. This dual impact on empowering women while addressing a critical need among cancer patients has garnered significant attention. The response from the international oncology community was overwhelmingly positive, with many experts expressing admiration for the innovative approach taken by the Cancer Institute.

WORLD PATIENT SAFETY WEEK, 2024





On September 10th, 2024, the Cancer Institute WIA Adyar held a successful Nursing Care Plan Workshop as part of its Patient Safety Day program. A total of 76 dedicated nurses from both the Dr. SK and Dr. VS campuses actively participated in the workshop, showcasing the Institute's commitment to enhancing patient care across all wards.

The workshop was led by Ms. Lydia Annie, the Nursing Director and NABH Assessor, alongside Mrs. Abilasha, a Nursing Educator from Kavery Hospital, Chennai. With extensive expertise, they participating guided the nurses essential through patient safety practices. The event was supported by our senior nursing staff, who worked in coordination with the lead faculty to ensure a smooth and enriching experience for all attendees.



Sponsored by Reliance Life Science, Pharma, the workshop included a range of engaging activities designed to improve diagnostic skills and patient safety awareness. Nurses participated in interactive role plays, villu paatu (a traditional storytelling musical form), and mime performances, all aligned with the theme, "Improving Diagnosis for Patient Safety." There were lectures and video demonstration followed by a hands on session. Participants had hands on training on distal femur and proximal tibia reconstruction using megaprostheses. The workshop had affiliation with IMSOS and TASO. The event was sponsored by XLO-are, healthium sutures and tetramed. The division of musculoskeletal oncology from the department of surgical oncology conducted a one day hands on saw bone model workshop on megaprostheses on September 14th, 2014. Over 65 delegates participated in the workshop. We had 3 eminent national faculty for the workshop. The workshop covered the basics of limb salvage surgery and skeletal reconstruction following it.



Fight For A Cure - Childhood cancer Awareness Month (September) The Cancer Institute(WIA) has a rich legacy in the field of pediatric cancer treatment. Over the years, we have made significant advancements in the field of pediatric oncology, pioneering and adapting new treatments and protocols that have improved survival rates and quality of life for young cancer patients.

AWARENESS IN FOCUS

Lung Cancer Screening and Awareness Initiatives

The Cancer Institute (WIA) launched India's first lung cancer screening research initiative, targeting tobacco users over 45 who consume more than one pack daily. In Perumbakkam, Chemmanchery, and Kannagi Nagar, 96 tobacco users were screened, with cessation interventions offered.

On 20th August 2024, a cancer awareness program in Kannagi Nagar focused on lung cancer screening for tobacco users aged 40+. This initiative benefited 53 individuals by highlighting the risks of tobacco use and the importance of early detection.

A similar event on 14th August 2024 in Perumbakkam provided information on breast, lung, and general cancer awareness, benefiting 56 people.

Additionally, a school awareness program was conducted across 10 schools, reaching 1,390 students. The program assessed students' knowledge and behavior regarding tobacco use and cancer prevention.

As part of the Young Ambassador for Cancer Control (YACC) Club, the institute, in collaboration with HCL Foundation, organized an "Orientation and Sensitization Program" for NSS Program Officers from four districts on 22nd August 2024. Attended by 120 officers, the event featured expert discussions on cancer prevention, early diagnosis, and the role of education in tobacco cessation.
