


As we step into 2025, it is a moment to reflect on the strides we have made and to reaffirm our commitment to the values that define the Cancer Institute (WIA).

SPOTLIGHT ON EXCELLENCE



Sterilization: Eliminating Microorganisms!

After decontamination, the instruments are sterilized to eliminate harmful microorganisms, including bacteria, viruses, and spores. CSSD uses various sterilization methods tailored to the material and nature of the instruments as indicated below:

Steam Sterilization: This high-temperature process is used for heat-resistant instruments, ensuring effective microbial deactivation.

Ethylene Oxide Sterilization: For delicate items that cannot withstand steam, ethylene oxide gas is used to sterilize instruments.

Hydrogen Peroxide Plasma Sterilization: This method is employed for delicate equipment, using low-temperature vapor to sterilize effectively.

<u>Assembly and Packaging: Maintaining Sterility!</u>

Once sterilized, instruments are carefully assembled into sets for specific surgical procedures, then packaged in sterile containers or wraps to maintain their sterility until use. CSSD ensures that these packages are sealed, labeled, and ready for distribution.

Inside Central Sterile Supply Department (CSSD)

CSSD at Cancer Institute(WIA) plays a vital role in ensuring the safety of patients by providing sterile medical and surgical equipment for variety of procedures. Whether for routine treatments or complex surgeries, CSSD is integral in preventing healthcare-associated infections.

<u>Cleanliness & Quality!</u> Decontamination : Cleaning and Disinfection

Instruments and medical devices used in patient care, such as surgical tools, endoscopes, and other equipment are carefully cleaned to remove visible debris, blood, and biological material. This ensures that instruments are free of organic matter, allowing an effective sterilization. The cleaning process uses specialized detergents and equipment to scrub, rinse, and dry instruments thoroughly

Sterile Supply Distribution and Inventory Management!

CSSD is responsible for distributing sterile supplies to operating rooms, endoscopy suites, and patient care units, ensuring timely availability for both routine and emergency procedures. Inventory management is another crucial function, where the department tracks and maintains stock levels to prevent shortages, ensuring costeffectiveness and minimizing waste.

Ensuring Safe and Effective Patient Care!

CSSD ensures that all medical and surgical equipment used in the hospital is properly cleaned, sterilized, and maintained, playing a crucial role in patient safety.

Their dedication behind the scenes is vital in preventing infections and ensuring that highquality, sterile instruments are available for every procedure.





Their work, showcased globally, reflects the dedication towards oncology and our service to humanity, that defines our institute. We look forward to the continued impact of research in the field of oncology.




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CERVIC CANCER AWARENESS MONTH
